Explore fascinating destinations such as Lisbon, Évora, Sintra and Azeitão, in authentic experiences that reveal the essence of this enchanting region.

Day 1 of the itinerary: Lisbon

Experience Summary: Explore the charms of the Portuguese capital on a comprehensive tour of the main historical and cultural sites, with highlights including the Belém neighborhood, Chiado, Baixa and the iconic Praça do Comércio.

During the tour, you will have the opportunity to taste the famous Pastel de Belém, a traditional Portuguese delicacy created in 1837, whose original recipe is kept secret.

The experience includes stops at the Belém Tower and the Padrão dos Descobrimentos, two emblematic historical monuments linked to the Age of Discoveries. At the Jerónimos Monastery, one of the main examples of the Manueline style and recognized as a UNESCO World Heritage Site, you can admire its impressive architecture.

End the tour at Praça do Comércio, one of Lisbon's most famous postcards, and cross the Arco da Rua Augusta to explore the charming streets of Baixa.

Day 2: Fátima and Óbidos.

Experience Summary: Visit the Sanctuary of Fátima, one of the most important pilgrimage destinations in the world, and discover the medieval charm of Óbidos, with its historic walls, cobblestone streets and artisan shops.

At the Sanctuary of Fátima, site of the religious apparitions in 1917, you will have the opportunity to visit the Basilica of Our Lady of the Rosary and the Chapel of the Apparitions, where faithful from all over the world seek moments of faith and reflection. The sanctuary welcomes millions of pilgrims every year, especially during the celebrations in May and October, which mark the apparitions of Our Lady.

Óbidos is a medieval village surrounded by well-preserved walls, providing a true journey through time. Its narrow cobblestone streets are lined with artisan shops, art galleries and cozy cafés. The highlights include the Church of Santa Maria, with its richly decorated interior, and the Castle of Óbidos, which currently operates as a guesthouse. During the visit, it is traditional to try the ginjinha in a chocolate cup, a cherry liqueur typical of the region, which combines flavor and local tradition.

Day 3: Sintra and Cascais.

Itinerary: Discover the magic of Sintra with a visit to the stunning Pena Palace, explore the westernmost point of Europe at Cabo da Roca and end the day in the charming historic center of Cascais.

Sintra is famous for its romantic atmosphere and lush landscapes. Perched on top of the hill, the Pena Palace stands out for its colorful and eclectic architecture, offering breathtaking panoramic views. The town is also home to other fascinating monuments, such as the Castelo dos Mouros, with its ancient walls and privileged views, and Quinta da Regaleira, known for its enigmatic gardens and mysterious initiatory well.

At Cabo da Roca, you will be at the westernmost point of continental Europe, where imposing cliffs meet the Atlantic Ocean. It is the perfect setting to capture memorable photos and admire the grandeur of nature.

In Cascais, a former fishing village transformed into a sophisticated seaside resort, you can explore the historic center with its charming streets, cozy cafes and elegant boutiques. Don't miss Boca do Inferno, an impressive rock formation sculpted by the waves of the sea, which provides a unique landscape and direct contact with the power of the Atlantic.

Attractions: Inside visit to Pena Palace

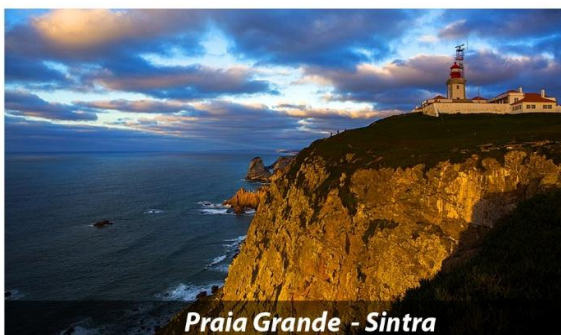

Day 4: Évora - World Heritage Site

Experience Summary: Explore the city of Évora, recognized as a UNESCO World Heritage Site. Enjoy a stroll through the historic center, visit the Chapel of Bones, the Roman Temple and the imposing Sé de Évora. End the experience with an exclusive tasting at the prestigious Cartuxa winery.

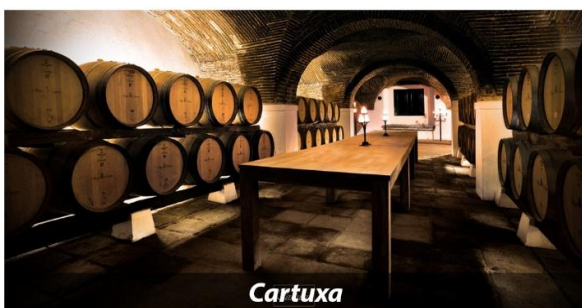
Évora is a true open-air museum, where centuries of history are revealed in its architecture and traditions. In the heart of the city, the Chapel of Bones stands out, one of the most emblematic and intriguing attractions, with its walls covered in thousands of human bones. The Cathedral impresses with its grandeur and offers a breathtaking panoramic view. The Roman Temple, known as the Temple of Diana, is one of the best preserved Roman remains in the Iberian Peninsula.

Walking through the historic center, you will find cobblestone streets, craft shops and restaurants that present the best of Alentejo cuisine. Another highlight is the Aqueduto da Água de Prata, an impressive 16th-century structure that runs through the city, testifying to the architectural ingenuity of the time.

The experience culminates with a visit to the Cartuxa winery, owned by the Eugénio de Almeida Foundation. Known for producing some of the most prestigious wines in Portugal, including the iconic Pêra-Manca. The winery offers an insight into the production process, a walk through the historic cellars and the opportunity to taste award-winning labels that express the essence of the Alentejo terroir.

Attractions: Visit + tasting at the Cartuxa winery and an internal visit to the Capela dos Ossos

Day 5: Azeitão - Flavors and Traditions

Experience Summary: Discover the best of Azeitão with a visit to the Bacalhôa winery, famous for its wines and artistic tiles. Explore the tile factory and the charming local historic center.

Azeitão is a region renowned for its winemaking and artisanal traditions. At the Bacalhôa winery, you will learn about the process of producing fine wines in an environment that combines history, art and oenology. The property stands out for its contemporary art collection and high-quality wines, ranging from full-bodied reds to aromatic muscats. The tile factory preserves Portuguese craftsmanship, with hand-painted pieces that reflect the country's rich cultural heritage. The historic center of the village is welcoming and offers the opportunity to taste the famous Azeitão Cheese, a creamy and distinctive artisanal cheese made with sheep's milk.

Attractions: Visit + tasting at the Bacalhôa winery
